Outcomes

The national average GPA for students admitted to medical school is 3.74. In the College of Sciences, the top quartile of students — where pre-med students would expect to rank — has an average GPA of 3.85 (range: 3.65-4.00). Georgia Tech students who are admitted to medical school have, on average, comparable GPAs and higher MCAT scores than the national average. The admission rate is also significantly higher than the national average. Recent destinations for our graduates include:

In addition to an academic advisor in your major, you will work closely with an advisor in **Pre-Health Advising**. This office maintains an active schedule of advising, mentoring, shadowing, networking, and preparing students for every stage of the application process.

Georgia Tech students have access to a large number and variety of opportunities for **shadowing and volunteer experiences** in Atlanta, many within just a short distance from campus.



The **Health and Medical Sciences minor** provides you with a credential that demonstrates your growing knowledge and expertise in the field of medicine through completion of classes that will be attractive to medical and other professional school admissions committees.

The campus has an active chapter of the **American Medical Student Association** and other student organizations such as the **Stamps Medical Ambassadors** and **Student Hospital Connections**.

Some of our **study abroad programs** are designed with collections of classes that are common for students interested in health-related careers, for example, those in Lyon, France (summer), Barcelona, Spain (fall), Australia/New Zealand (spring), and Edinburgh, Scotland (summer).
